

SNO Studio Project:

SNO offers a **non-residential** studio by application. It is available via written expression addressed to SNO Program Coordinator. See website for contact details: <http://www.sno.org.au/contact.html>. Two to three consecutive non-residential studios may be allocated in one year. An exhibition may be offered at end depending on gallery availability and other factors.

Aims:

SNO Studio Project aims to provide a full access studio facility for contemporary visual arts practitioners of any kind; to support the development of new work for exhibition at SNO or elsewhere; and to co-facilitate professional development opportunities.

Details:

The SNO non-residential studio may generally be offered for a period of three to six months. The offer of an exhibition may be forthcoming at or towards the the end of the period.

Note: unless offered as a fully subsidized non residential studio, applicants will be charged a standard rental of \$100 per week, minimum of one month.

Conditions:

At this stage SNO offers **no stipend** and **no living allowance** of any kind. All applicants are therefore responsible for costs and are required to pay a refundable bond of \$200 to cover any damage.

SNO reserves the right to decide not to offer an exhibition.

Note: Marrickville Council has an apartment available by application, however this must be applied for separately (and well in advance). The Council's Arts Officer reserves separate approval. See Marrickville Council web link for details:
